About the Workshop

Germany is a global leader in providing alternative pathways to education for young students, emphasizing work-based learning to prepare them for successful careers from an early age. While the concept of career-connected education has been gaining traction in US high schools over the past decade, there remains a crucial element missing: the incorporation of global skills into these pathways. In this hybrid workshop attended by stakeholders in Germany and the US, we will introduce the German American Partnership Program (GAPP), a US-based nonprofit organization established in 1972 that has facilitated the meeting of 400,000 young students and teachers from both countries. We will collectively brainstorm ideas on how to establish career-focused pathways for high school students in the US and Germany- starting with student exchanges. Our aim is to explore various models, build capacity, and envision pathways that will empower students to contribute to the development of innovative industries in both countries.
